(a) a Company established under section 8 of the Companies Act, or a Registered Public Trust or Registered Society, having charitable objects and CSR Registration Number; or

(b) beneficiaries of the said CSR project, in the form of self-help groups, collectives, entities; or

(c) a public authority.

Provided that any capital asset created/ acquired by SNS out of GIL CSR expenditure prior to the commencement of the Companies (CSR Policy) Amendment Rules, 2021, shall within a period of 180 days from such commencement i.e. by 20 July, 2021 comply with the requirement of this rule, which may be extended by a further period of not more than 90 days with the approval of the Board based on reasonable justification.
