

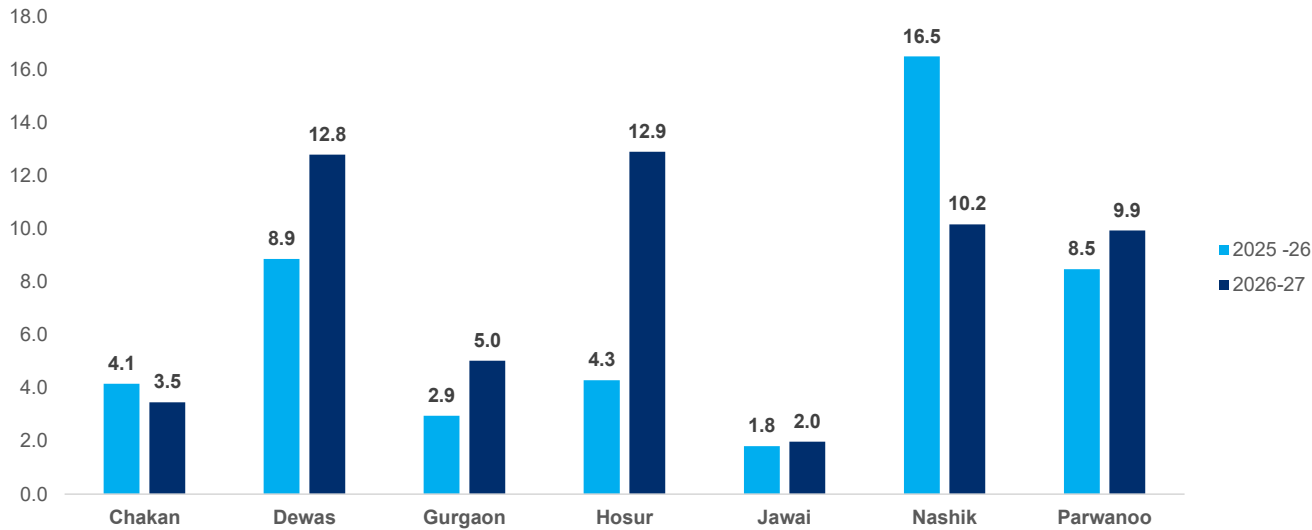
# CSR ACTION PLAN: Apr '26 – Mar '27

2025 vs. 2026: CSR Budget Allocation Across 07 Locations

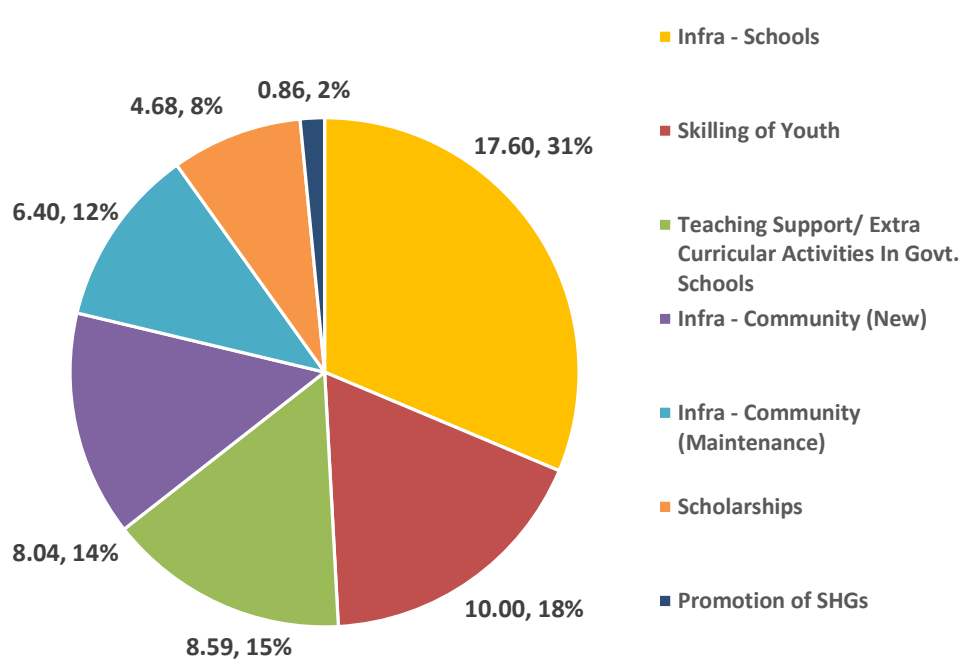

### CSR Budget Allocation Across Locations: Key Points

- In view of growing strategic importance of Hosur, budget allocation increased from 9% in 2025 to 23% in 2026; addition of initiatives in Shoolagiri block
- Between 2025 & 2026, allocations for **Jawai and Parwanoo remain unchanged** at 4% and 18% respectively
- **Near 50% decrease in budget allocation for Nashik** as large scale infra project of Construction of a Girls Hostel at Vill. Velunje completed over last two F.Y.
- **Allocation at Dewas increased** from 19% in 2025 to 23% in 2026 as GIL only ANAND Group company in the location to meet needs of targeted communities

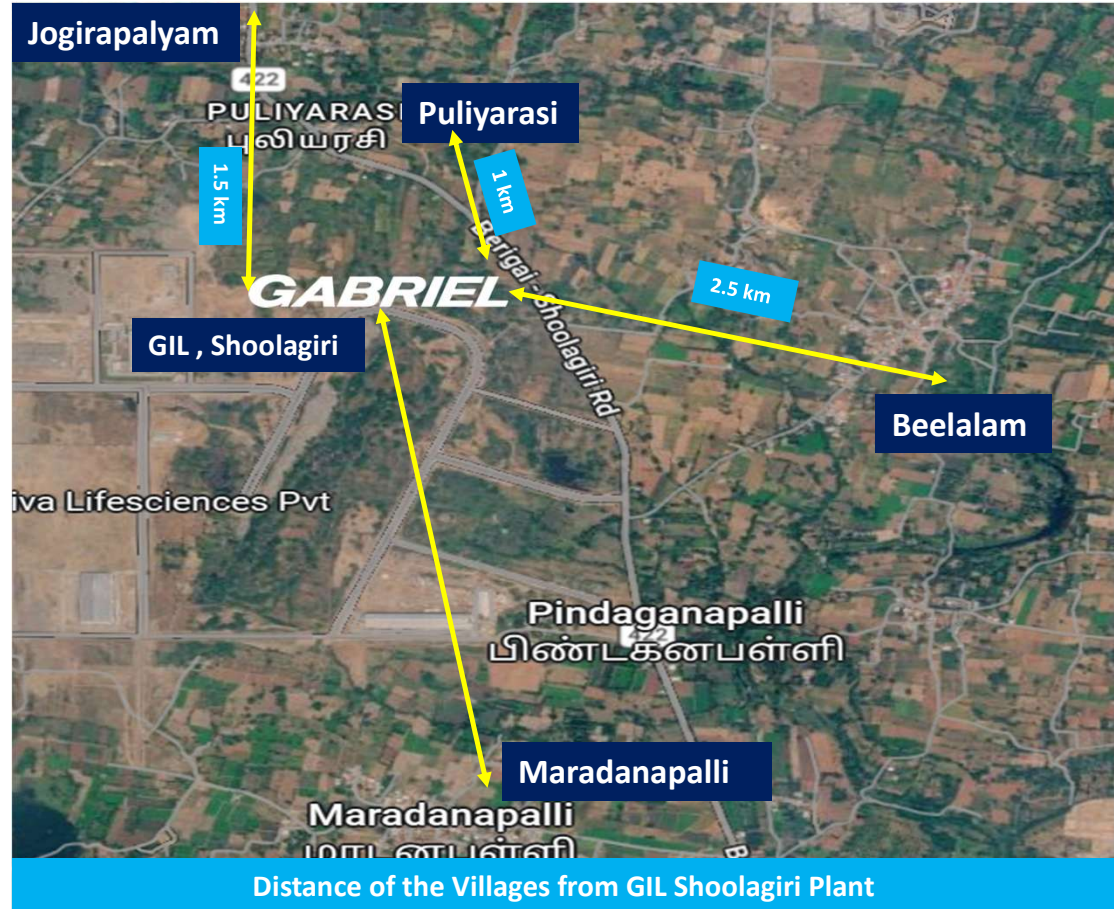
## Location Map : GIL CSR Project Scope 2026-27 in Shoolagiri Block

**About Shoolagiri :** The Shoolagiri Block in Krishnagiri District of T.N. comprises around 40+ Gram Panchayat villages with several smaller habitations. **Approximately 70%–80% of families in the block are dependent on agriculture and allied activities** for their livelihood.

Based on site visits to the **main village Maradanapalli and its sub-villages- Puliyarasi and Jogirapalyam** and to **Beelalam village** (under the Chembarasanapalli Gram Panchayat), along with **discussions with the Block Development Officer** and local villagers, **immediate needs of the area identified include -**

1. Declining groundwater levels, poor water quality
2. Inadequate street lighting
3. Gaps in basic infra in schools and Anganwadis
4. Limited livelihood opportunities / seasonal migration

In Year 1 action plan, needs around 2 and 3 are being addressed. With strengthening of relationship with govt. departments, 1 and 4 will be taken up in subsequent years.

### Transect Walk and Interaction:

The SNSF team conducted transect walks across the villages and interacted with key stakeholders, including community leaders, men, women, farmers, Gram Panchayat representatives, and school staff, to understand the challenges and scope for development.

### Visit to the potential sites :

Visited potential sites such as Anganwadi's, schools, village connecting roads, water resources, and bus stop locations to identify the scope for development

### Meeting with Block Development Officer:

With GIL team, briefed about the findings of the survey to Ms. Vijaya, Block Development Officer. She mentioned that the identified scope in the surveyed villages is aligned with local needs. The BDO office will further share a detailed list of potential projects in the area.

- **Beneficiary numbers include both direct and indirect no. lives impacted through a particular CSR initiative.**
- For e.g. when an individual is awarded a scholarship entire family benefits due to an ease on its finances.
- Similarly, when member of a self help group initiates a livelihood activity or gets access to micro-credit loans, the additional flow of income aids the well being of the entire household.
- Same is the case with a youth who after completing a skill development course supported by GIL, secures a job/initiates self employment he/she becomes a contributing member of his/her family

In above mentioned and similar instances beneficiary numbers include not only the immediate beneficiary but his/her family members as well. The beneficiary numbers are likely to change by March 2027 and are tentative at this stage.
